## Classroom Management

Note: Non-compliance with the rules outlined below will result in In-Class Grade deduction. It is important to understand that a low In-Class Grade will adversely, and significantly, affect the overall class grade. Furthermore, students who continuously fail to adhere to these rules risk receiving a U in citizenship.

- Bring needed materials to class
- No food. No exceptions!

- Pay attention, engage in appropriate and constructive activities, and do not be disruptive
- Inappropriate use of cell phones is strictly prohibited during class
  - **There is absolutely no texting during class (no exceptions!)**

- Respect and be polite to everyone
- Understand that all decisions made by the teacher (i.e., me) are final and not subject to debate or compromise. When asked to change seats students are required to comply without argument.
- **IMPORTANT: Missed tests/assignments must be made up within one week.**

*In-Class Grade:*

This grade is based entirely on what takes place in the classroom. It is a subjective evaluation of the student's commitment to learning, constructive participation in classroom activities, behavior, academic honesty, skill displayed, and respect of teacher and peers. The student's actions and attitude throughout the unit will determine whether this grade goes up or down. It is important to understand that the in-class grade is not just a behavior/conduct grade. Yes, behavior is an important part of this grade but there is much more to the grade than just good behavior! To be sure, students who are rude, defiant, and/or disrespectful and anyone using a cellphone in class inappropriately will see the in-class grade drop.

## **CHEATING:**

- A student caught cheating on a quiz or test will be given a grade of ZERO and could face further disciplinary action.
- Any student observed with a cell phone during a test will receive an immediate grade of ZERO on **both** the test and in-class grade.

### General School Policies\*

**Attendance:**

Proper attendance to this class is required. Classwork missed due to truancy cannot be made up. ANY STUDENT WITH TEN TRUANCIES TO THIS CLASS MAY BE DROPPED FROM IT WITH A FAILING GRADE. (EC: 49067, BP: 5121) Truancy is a class absence not properly cleared in the Attendance Office; multiple truanancies will have an impact on your grade in this course. If dropped, students may discuss credit recovery options in the Counseling Office.

**Tardy Policy:**

Students are expected to report to this class on time. Students who incur multiple tardies may be subject to disciplinary consequences by the teacher and/or school administration, which may include (but are not limited to) detention, Saturday Detention, and unsatisfactory Citizenship marks.

**Citizenship Grades:**

Students who earn unsatisfactory marks in Citizenship (“U”) in any of their classes may find themselves suspended or removed from co-curricular activities and/or placed on a behavior contract for regular review. Two or more unsatisfactory citizenship grades on the quarter reports are automatic removal from participating in co-curricular activities such as: performances, games, etc.

**Academic Integrity:**

All students are expected to complete their work ethically, honestly, and as directed by their teachers. Academic dishonesty includes (but is not limited to) copying another student’s classwork or homework, cheating on tests, and plagiarism; these are serious offenses that inhibit the educational process, and they will not be tolerated. Students who are academically dishonest may see their grades reduced, their citizenship marks affected, their athletic and co-curricular eligibility jeopardized, and their ability to obtain letters of recommendation for college applications from teachers and counselors endangered.
